 - Discuss the usefulness for action plans in a patient's ability to recognize and manage their disease state.
 - Review the patient population at risk for peripheral arterial disease and the role for screening in these individuals.
 - Discuss the various treatment options available and the types of patients best suited for those treatments.
 - Understand the various modalities for evaluation of peripheral arterial disease and appropriate selection of patients to screen.
 - Review and discuss the goals of lipid management for different patient populations.
 - Present a thorough overview of the options for lipid management and discuss the role of each of these agents in lipid management.
